(OMAHA, NE) - "An EPIC Day," hosted by EPIC for Girls at the College of Saint Mary Fieldhouse, came alive with excitement and inspiration today. The inaugural event welcomed nearly 600 eager attendees, spotlighting the vital importance of sports and equal opportunity. The day's luminary was Dawn Staley, the celebrated Women's Basketball Head Coach for the University of South Carolina.

Dalhia Lloyd, EPIC for Girls Board President, expressed her sentiments, "Sports instilled in me the value of teamwork and collaboration. It's shaped my professional journey and personal connections. It's taught me both how to lean on and how to lead."

The spotlighted guest, Dawn Staley, shared pearls of wisdom:

"Earning a win, particularly against male opponents, often comes with resistance. Wear their displeasure as a badge of honor."

"I view myself as a merchant of dreams. When you embrace this role, you pour into others with a zeal that's uncontainable."

"Your passion should be the compass of your life. If it doesn't direct your path, it's time to search anew."

"It's essential to maintain focus. Ensure that your circle feeds your passion, for detractors can easily sidetrack you."

Reflecting on guidance for young sportswomen aiming to shine in secondary education and beyond, Staley noted, "While my youthful days were heavily skewed towards basketball, I now realize the essence of balance. My counsel to young athletes today is to relish life's varied offerings."

On allyship, she emphasized, "Silence, especially during challenging times, is not an option. It's vital to voice your perspective and then actively engage in listening."

The inaugural "An EPIC Day," steered by EPIC for Girls, has undoubtedly raised the bar for events championing equal opportunities in sports. With champions like Dawn Staley and the eversupportive EPIC community at the helm, the horizon looks bright for aspirant sportswomen.
